Funding for each proposal: Personnel: 1-2 PhD

Project Duration: ca. 9-12 years

Funding: much higher than DFG-Research Unit

International Research Training Groups ("Internationale Graduiertenkollegs")

- Goals: to establish joint doctoral training between a group at a German university and a partner group at a foreign university
- Location: at one German and one foreign university
- Duration: limited specific time period (up to ? years)
- Funding: doctoral students, post-docs, consumables, visiting professors, sabbaticals by participating university teachers, small conferences and travel by doctoral students, coordination work.
- Remarks: (i) Doctoral students incorporated in research at participating institutions
 - (ii) Interdisciplinary research and study programme desired
 - (iii) Each doctoral student should complete a 6-month research stay at respective partner institutions.
